

Economics Minor Checklist

Without AP/Transfer Credit in Economics

- ECON 101D Economic Principles
- ECON 201D Intermediate Microeconomics I
(This course has a calculus prerequisite. Please see the Undergraduate Bulletin for a list of courses that fulfill this prerequisite.)

Upper-Level Economics Electives

Three additional economics courses, of which no more than one course may be at the 200-level (other than ECON 205, 208, and 201, which may all be counted toward the minor) and two courses at the 300-level or higher. Courses 500-549 can only be counted toward the minor with the approval of the director of undergraduate studies. You are not permitted to substitute similar courses in other departments at Duke.

- ECON 200-level or above
- ECON 300-level **or** ECON 205, 208, 210
- ECON 300-level **or** ECON 205, 208, 210

With AP/Transfer Credit in Economics

- ECON 21 & 22 (AP credit for microeconomics and macroeconomics) **or** ECON 23 & 24 (transfer credit)
- ECON 201D Intermediate Microeconomics I

Upper-Level Economics Electives

Three additional economics courses, of which no more than one course may be at the 200-level (other than ECON 205, 208, and 201, which may all be counted toward the minor) and two courses at the 300-level or higher. - ECON 200-level or above
- ECON 300-level **or** ECON 205, 208, 210
- ECON 300-level **or** ECON 205, 208, 210
