## PREREQUISITES TO THE MAJOR

\_\_\_\_\_ MATH 122/112L (32/32L) **or** Math 122L (41)

\_\_\_\_\_ MATH 202 (102) or MATH 212 (103) or Math 222 (105)  
(or any higher level Math course with MATH 212(103) as a pre-requisite) <sup>1</sup>

### STATISTICS REQUIREMENT

\_\_\_\_\_ Choose One from the following:  
STAT 111 (103) recommended; STAT 230/MATH 230 (104/135), STAT 130 (113) OR  
STAT 250/MATH 342 (114/136)

## CORE ECONOMICS COURSES

*Core Courses should be taken sequentially (Econ 205D (105D) may be taken as a co-requisite with Econ 210D (110D)):*

*Any five economics courses at the 300-level or above, with at least one course at the 300-level and one course at the 400 level. Courses 500-549 can only be counted toward the major with the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies*

### GENERAL RESTRICTIONS:

- A maximum of **TWO** transfer credit courses will be accepted toward the major (B.S. or B.A. degrees). This applies to courses taken in the USA and to study abroad courses. One exception is the London School of Economics (LSE) full-year (Fall and Spring) program, from which a maximum of **FOUR** courses may be counted toward the major.
- ACES enforces prerequisites for many Econ courses.

#### Notes:

<sup>1</sup>Students may demonstrate proficiency in Mathematics by placing out of Math 212(103) or successfully completing a higher-level Math course that has Math 212 (103) as a pre-requisite. Because Math placement information is not on a student's official academic record, students seeking a proficiency waiver should secure the approval of the Math DUS.

<sup>2</sup>Students with credit for both AP Macro (4 or higher) and AP Micro (4 or higher) may waive out of Econ 101 (51).

<sup>3</sup>Note that pre-reqs are enforced on Econ 205D (105D), and include Econ 201 (55D), Math 111L (31L) and *either* Math 202 (102) or Math 212 (103).
