

FINANCE CONCENTRATION WORKSHEET

The requirements for the Finance Concentration are the same as those for the Economics B.S. major, with the addition of the following requirements:

CORE FINANCE COURSE

Econ 172/372: Intermediate Finance¹

(This course may not be used as an elective for the Finance Concentration. Students pursuing the BS degree, without the Finance Concentration, may use this course as one of their five electives.)

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS:

- Only **TWO** transfer credit courses will be accepted toward the major (B.S. or B.A. degrees). This applies to courses taken in the USA and to study abroad courses. One exception is the London School of Economics (LSE) full-year (Fall and Spring) program, from which up to **FOUR** courses may be counted toward the major.
- ACES enforces prerequisites for many Econ courses

²Students matriculating prior to Fall 2012 may use Econ 183/274 as an elective for the major. Those matriculating Fall 2012 or later can only use Econ 183/274 as an elective for the Econ or Finance minor (not major or concentration)

³Certain Independent Studies and Honors Seminars may be used to satisfy the Finance Electives requirement, with advance approval of the DUS.
